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Letter from the President...

On behalf of the Association, I again thank everyone for their support and participation in our organization. It is only with your dedication and commitment that we are able to achieve our goal of providing quality instruction to our youth in a fun atmosphere.

The recent past has proven to be an eventful one. In the last month we have implemented two spring programs which are new to our Association, Pucks-and-Sticks and Learn-to-Play, in order to offer additional services to our players to continue to assist them in developing their skills and love for the game.

Also, we have begun and, to a large degree, completed our annual selection of coaches for the upcoming season. A list of travel coaches can be viewed on our web site.

Finally, we are making an adjustment to the manner in which our travel teams are labeled. Several years ago we implemented the concept of having an Additional Entry (AE) team compete in the squirt, pee wee, and bantam travel divisions. These AE teams were third travel teams comprised of both first and second year players and were designed to act as developmental programs to “feed” our A and AA teams with players who desired at some point to play for one of those teams. However, while we feel the existence of this program continues to have merit, we have decided as a board, if numbers permit, to have two teams, and to refer to these teams as our A #2 and AA #2 teams. We feel this classification is appropriate due to the fact those teams are rostered with USA Hockey as either A or AA teams, as the AE concept is peculiar to Canadian minor hockey. The following concepts are applicable to our A #2 and AA #2 teams: (1) Just as in prior years, our other two travel teams (A and AA or as they are now referred to, A #1 and AA #1) will be designated, prior to the start of the season, to play in both the district play-offs (and state play-offs, if those teams win their district) and the Silver Stick Tournament, although the AA #2 team may have the opportunity to compete in the Silver Stick tournament at lower tier should the Silver Stick Committee choose to extend such an invitation. (2) This re-labeling of our A #2 and AA #2 teams will have no impact on their ability to compete at the AE level in all Canadian tournaments. (3) The A #1 and A #2 teams must have a joint tryout; the AA #1 and AA #2 teams also must have a joint tryout; and the #1 teams will each have the opportunity to choose their respective teams prior to the time the #2 teams choose their teams. Therefore, by necessity all players who wish to compete at the travel level will be required to try out for the A #1 team, if they are a first-year player, or the AA #1 team, if they are a second-year player, in order to afford our coaches at those levels the opportunity to evaluate all the players in his respective division. However, if, for whatever reason, a player chooses instead to play at the A #2 or AA #2 level, even if that player makes the A #1 or AA #1 team, that is his or her choice, but a conversation between the player’s parent(s) and the coach of the #1 team must occur before this happens. (4) The #2 teams may, but are not required to, compete in the Detroit Little Caesar’s League.

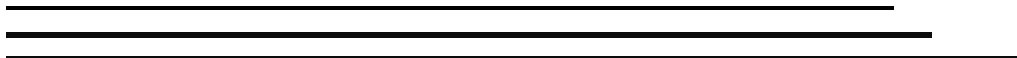
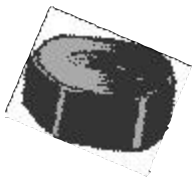
On a different note, this is just a reminder that the financial reports for all teams were due by April 15, and all ice and fund raising fees were also due at that time.

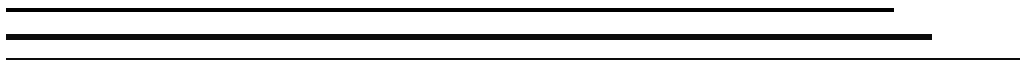
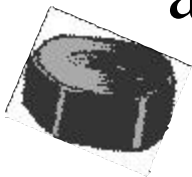

Proposed Constitution and By-Law Changes

Constitution Changes

Current

Article I - Name

The name of this association shall be the Port Huron Hockey Association and may be referred to herein as the "PHHA" or the "Association".

Proposed

Article I - Name

The name of this association shall be the Port Huron Minor Hockey Association and may be referred to herein as the "PHMHA" or the "Association".

Current

Article V

Section 3

The Board of directors may, upon the recommendations of the Treasurer, set a fee to be paid by each player and sponsor of the Association, and a schedule for payment of same. At the discretion of the board, membership in the Association may be conditioned upon the timely payment of said fees. The Board may, in its discretion, make special assessments of the membership.

- A. FAMILY DISCOUNTS - If a family registers more than one child, in the association, they can qualify for a family discount of 10% for each additional child. The family must register all players at the same time, in order to qualify for the discount. The registration fee may be paid in 3 monthly installments.
- B. PAYMENTS - Registration fees may be paid in installments. Balance of registration must be paid by September 1st or the player will not be drafted and/or rostered.

The Board of directors may, upon the recommendations of the Treasurer, set a fee to be paid by each player and sponsor of the Association, and a schedule for payment of same. At the discretion of the board, membership in the Association may be conditioned upon the timely payment of said fees. The Board may, in its discretion, make special assessments of the membership.

- A. FAMILY DISCOUNTS - If a family registers more than one child, in the association, they can qualify for a family discount of 10% for each additional child. The family must register all players at the same time, in order to qualify for the discount. The registration fee may be paid in 4 monthly installments. House registration (Mite – Midget) paid in full by September 1 receive a 10% discount.
- B. DEPOSITS - All players Mite thru Midget will pay a non-refundable deposit.

Addendum: The following rule change was voted on and passed at the M.A.H.A. summer meeting July 10, 2005; By-Law No. 2 A. Membership Fee – Annual registration fees and/or dues may be established by the Board of Directors for team registration or for membership in the M.A.H.A. B. Other assessments necessary for the operation of this Association may, from time to time, be established by the Board of Directors. All such assessments, etc., shall be payable as directed by said Board or Executive committee, in the Board’s absence. Failure to comply with either Section A or B of this by-law and any rules promulgated hereunder shall result in the immediate suspension of said non-complying league, association, team and/or individual(s) and said suspension shall remain in full force and effect until such time as there is full compliance.

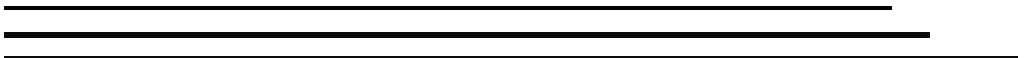
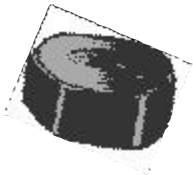
Section 7 The coach or manager is responsible for those skaters on the ice during a practice session. Such skaters shall only include the coach and his designated assistants and registered team players. All players must wear complete protective equipment at all times while on the ice during practices, tryouts, and games.

Section 8 The coach is responsible for seeing that his team leaves the ice immediately at the conclusion of their scheduled practice time. If a coach desires to eliminate the resurfacing of the ice prior to his practice, he must notify the ice machine operator fifteen (15) minutes prior to the start of the scheduled practice.

Section 9 The assistant coach or manager shall assume the responsibilities and duties of the head coach in his absence.

Section 10 It is the responsibility of each head coach to provide competent instruction in the game of ice hockey for all players on his team, promote citizenship, fellowship and sportsmanship at all times, adhere to league Constitution and Bylaws, and appoint a competent manager and assistant coach.

Section 11 Each coach shall sign a receipt for all PHHA jerseys and equipment issued to their team.

- B. To ensure volunteers for the Silver Stick Tournament, ALL PHHA teams will be allowed to schedule only one (1) league game and NO practices during each weekend (Thursday through Sunday) of the Silver Stick Tournament. ARTICLE XII - TRAVEL PROGRAM

Insert as Section 2 and renumber the remaining sections

Section 2 Team Divisions and Classes: If numbers permit:

A. The PHMHA shall consist of the following travel divisions: Mite, Squirt, Pee Wee, Bantam, and Midget.

B. Each travel division shall contain the following classes:

1. A first minor team which, for purposes of USA Hockey registration, shall be designated as an "A" team. If a division contains a second minor team, then the first minor team shall be referred to as the "A #1" team of that division which, prior to the start of the season, shall be designated to represent the PHMHA in both the "A" class of the district tournament (and state tournament, if that team wins its district tournament) and the International Silver Stick Finals Tournament.

2. A second minor team which, for purposes of USA Hockey registration, shall be designated as an "A" team. This team shall be referred to as the "A #2" team of that division.

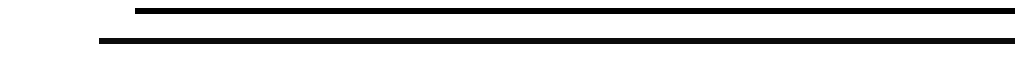
3. A first major team which, for purposes of USA Hockey registration, shall be designated as a "AA" team. If a division contains a second major team, then the first major team shall be referred to as the "AA #1" team of that division which, prior to the start of the season, shall be designated to represent the PHMHA in both the "AA" class of the district tournament (and state tournament, if that team wins its district tournament; and national tournament, if that team wins its state tournament) and the International Silver Stick Finals Tournament.

4. A second major team which, for purposes of USA Hockey registration, shall be designated as a "AA" team. This team shall be referred to as the "AA #2" team of that division.

C. The A #1 and A #2 teams in each division must conduct a joint tryout, and the AA #1 and AA #2 team in each division also must conduct a joint tryout, from which the coaching staff of the #1 team of that class shall have the opportunity to select players for its team. After the coaching staff of the #1 team of that class has selected players for its team, the coaching staff of the #2 team of that class shall have the opportunity to select players for its team from the players remaining after selection of the #1 team of that class.

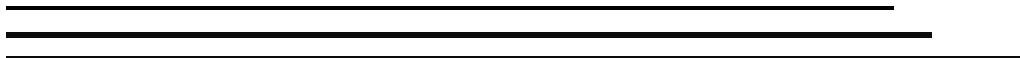
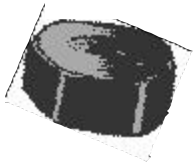
D. If a player who has been selected by the #1 team of his or her class elects instead to play for the #2 team of his or her class, he or she may do so, and the head coach of the #1 team promptly shall execute any and all releases necessary to permit such player to do so.

E. If there are not enough players to create two #2 teams in any division, then the Board of Directors shall make a determination regarding whether any #2 teams shall be created for that division, and if so whether an A #2 team or AA #2 team shall be created for that division.



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Travel Coaches
